Barn, c.1700. Sandstone rubble with roof of stone slate and slate, now mostly missing. At the left the shippon end projects forwards and has a door with chamfered surround. Further right the roof is carried across the wide entrance as a canopy, with right-hand cheek. The doors are har-hung with studded vertical oak planks. The doorway has a timber lintel. Further right there is a blocked 1st floor doorway, and a window on each floor with hollow-chamfered surround and central mullion removed. At the right is a door with chamfered surround, the right-hand jamb now moved inwards to make the doorway narrower. Above the lintel is a worn plaque inscribed with initials and a C17 date, now illegible. Coped gables. Interior has 3 trusses with tie beams, high collars, and raking queen struts. At the rear is a threshing door. Against the rear wall are later lean-to shippons.

House, c.1600 with C19 additions. Sandstone rubble with slate roof. 2 storeys. Earliest part gabled, projecting forwards with one-bay additions to each side. Probably the surviving cross-wing of an earlier house. Additions have modern windows with plain reveals and projecting sills. Front wall of gabled wing has ovolo-moulded and chamfered mullioned windows with hoods, offset to the right of centre. The ground-floor one is of 5 lights (partly restored) and the 1st floor one of 4 lights. Under the apex there is a small opening with plain reveals. Coped gable with kneelers. Present door, in left-hand return wall of wing, has plain stone surround. Chimneys on gable of right-hand addition and on ridge of wing. Inside, the front room of the early wing has 2 chamfered main joists. The owner reported finding unexplained timbers in the right-hand wall of the wing, possibly remains of an earlier building.

House, probably early C18, altered. Watershot sandstone with stone slate roof and brick chimney caps. 2 storeys, 4 bays. Windows sashed with glazing bars. Windows have cyma-moulded surrounds, except for those to the left-hand bay and the 1st floor window of the 2nd bay, which have plain reveals. The ground-floor window of the 3rd bay has 2 sashes. The door between the 2nd and 3rd bays has a plain stone surround and is now covered by a porch-like projection, glazed above a stone base. This has no outer doorway. At the right is a 2nd door under a larger stone and glazed porch with a door in its left-hand return wall. Chimneys on left-hand gable and between 3rd and 4th bays. At the rear are 2 2-light mullioned windows with inner cyma moulding and outer chamfer. Inside there are boxed axial beams.
