House, 1665. Sandstone rubble with stone slate roof now largely missing. L-plan. A symmetrical composition of 3 storeys, with one gabled bay on each side of 3-storey gabled porch. Windows double-chamfered with mullions and hoods. Those to the outer bays are of 4 lights except for the left-hand one on the ground floor which is of 5. The porch has a window of 3 lights on the 1st floor and 2 on the 2nd floor. Above the 1st floor window is a stone panel carved with a dog. The outer porch doorway has a chamfered surround with 'GT [George Talbot] 1665' inscribed on the lintel. The inner door surround is chamfered with a cambered head. Gables coped with kneelers. Chimney, with brick cap, on ridge in line with right-hand side of porch. Central part of left-hand gable wall now collapsed (June 1985). The rear wall of this south-west part of the house has a 2-light window on the ground and 1st floors. At the left, viewed from the rear, is a gabled wing which has a C19 ground-floor window with plain stone surround and flat-faced mullion. On each of the other floors there is a 4-light and a 2-light C17 window, the right-hand one on the 1st floor blocked. At the left is a C19 single-storey gabled porch. The outer doorway has a chamfered stone surround with Tudor arch. The north-east gable wall of the house has 3 ground-floor windows with plain reveals, a blocked C17 window on the 1st floor and a 2-light 2nd floor window. Interior not fully accessible at time of survey. Front door opens into a corridor between 2 solid walls. At the rear of this is a C19 dog-leg stair with stick balusters. To the right of the corridor are 2 rooms, a smaller one at the front, and a larger one at the rear which has boxed beams and a fireplace with C19 grate. To the left of the corridor the main room is largely filled by debris and has a collapsed boxed beam.

Bridge over the River Ribble, 1789. Sandstone ashlar. 3 segmental arches with triangular cutwaters, string course, and solid parapet with coping. Part of this bridge is in Dutton C.P. (q.v.)

House, probably C17, altered early-to-mid C18 and later C19. Sandstone and brick, rendered, with stone slate roof. 2 storeys. To the right of the door is a 5-light double-chamfered mullioned window with hood. To the left is a modern window with plain reveals. On the 1st floor are 4 modern windows with plain reveals and stone sills. The door has a stone doorcase with attached Ionic columns carrying an entablature. Above the cornice and partly within the open moulded segmental pediment is a narrow horizontal light. Coped gables have kneelers with ball finials. Gable chimneys, the left-hand one with projecting stack.

Toll house, early-to-mid C19. Squared sandstone with slate roof. Single storey. Windows have plain stone surrounds with round heads. North-east wall of 2 bays. North-west end 3-sided, the outer sides having windows and the central side a door with plain stone surround. Brick chimney on ridge.

Houses, 1747 and 1828. Sandstone rubble with roofs of stone slate and slate. 2 storeys. The earlier house, now disused, faces south and is of double-depth plan. On each side of a 2-storey gabled porch it has one bay with 3-light flush chamfered mullioned windows, except for the right-hand ground-floor window which is sashed with glazing bars and rendered surround. The porch has a 2-light 1st floor window. The door has a quoined surround with 'G D J 1747' inscribed on the lintel. Under the apex of the gable, which is coped with kneelers, is a shield and inscription: 'T 1828 A'. Coped gables with chimneys. Overlapping the facade slightly at the right is a narrow 2-storey wing projecting forwards from the gable wall of the adjoining farmhouse. It has a coped gable with kneelers and ball finial and a tall 1st floor window with chamfered surround, central mullion, and hood. The east facade of the farmhouse has one bay on each side of a 2-storey gabled porch. On the ground floor they have modern French windows, the right-hand one in a chamfered stone surround with hood. The 1st floor windows have similar surrounds with hoods. The 1st floor porch window retains its central mullion. The door has a stone surround with Tudor-arched head and hood. Coped gables with kneelers, the porch gable having a pine cone finial. Gable chimneys with rendered octagonal caps. ACORN
