House, 1655. Sandstone rubble with stone slate roof. 2 storeys, 3 bays. Lobby-entry plan. Windows mullioned, double-chamfered with hoods. They are of 5 lights except for those to the 2nd bay which are of 7 lights, all with diamond leading. Between the 2nd and 3rd bays is a 2-storey porch under a catslide roof. Its 1st floor oversails and has a 2-light window in the right-hand return wall. The door has a chamfered surround. The lintel was inscribed 'LBM 1655' (VCH) but all trace of this has been destroyed by sand blasting. Chimneys in line with porch and on left-hand gable, which is coped with kneelers. The front elevation has inappropriate strap pointing. At the rear is a blocked 1st floor window which had timber mullions. Inside, all 3 ground-floor rooms have chamfered axial beams, the right-hand room with exposed chamfered and stopped common joists. The middle room has an inglenook with chamfered and stopped bressumer and stone jamb. A similar fireplace backing onto it in the right-hand room has been partly blocked and part of the bressumer removed. The left-hand room has a chamfered Tudor-arched parlour fireplace. In the right-hand 1st floor room part of a blocked chamfered fireplace is visible. The roof trusses are constructed from re-used crucks. In the loft a stepped 3-light mullioned window in the right-hand gable now faces into the adjoining barn.

House, with southern end now used as stable, 1615, altered probably late C19. Sandstone rubble with slate roof. 2 storeys, with plinth. House of 2 bays. Ground-floor windows modern with plain stone surrounds. 1st floor windows of 6 lights with ovolo-moulded mullions and transoms, and outer chamfer. At the left a sashed window with no glazing bars and plain reveals lights the stable loft. The door, between bays under a glazed porch, has a C19 chamfered stone surround with a re-tooled Tudor-arched lintel inscribed: '1615'. Chimneys to each side of house. The right-hand gable wall has 2 double-chamfered cellar windows, partly blocked, of 2 and 3 lights. A projection from the rear wall of the stable, under a catslide roof, appears to be a truncated chimney stack. The left-hand gable wall has a lower ground level. A stable door with plain stone surround cuts through a blocked original window within the plinth. Above it is a pitching hole with plain stone surround, within a blocked window with hood. Inside, the house has 3 C17 panelled doors on the 1st floor and some re-used C17 panelling on the ground floor. Inside the stable the top of a blocked segmental-arched fireplace can be seen in the rear wall, below the present ground level. Above on the 1st floor is a chamfered fireplace with Tudor-arched head. The roof appears to have a C19 king-post truss.

House, c.1600, altered 1735 and 1874. Sandstone rubble with stone slate roof. Original house has projecting cross wings at each side of recessed central range. 2 storeys. Facade has band below parapet with urns, continued as gable copings to cross-wings, added in 1735. Left-hand cross-wing has 10-light mullioned and transomed window, hollow-chamfered with outer chamfer and hood. On the 1st floor are 2 sashed windows with no glazing bars. Central range of 3 bays has 8-light windows on the ground floor similar to that of the cross-wing. On the 1st floor are sashed windows with no glazing bars. In the central bay is a single-storey porch with a parapet stepped up over a shaped door lintel, above which is a plaque inscribed: 'LGNS 1874'. To each side of the porch is a lead downspout with hopper head inscribed: 'IWT 1735'. The right-hand cross-wing has a 2-storey mullioned and transomed canted bay window of 1874. To its right is a gabled addition of 1874 in a similar style, with a 10-light mullioned and transomed window on each floor. Chimneys on ridge of left-hand cross-wing, to right of porch, and to right of right-hand cross-wing. Inside, the door opens against a fireplace dated 1874, but retaining part of a stone arch dated 1712 or 1713. No other exposed features of architectural interest were visible at time of survey.
