House, mid C18. Watershot sandstone with stone slate roof. Double-depth plan. 2 storeys with attic, 2 bays. Windows of 3 lights with plain reveals and with mullions repaired with cement. All have glazing bars and have the middle lights sashed. Between bays is a blocked doorway with plain reveals and chamfered lintel. Gable chimneys. At the rear a cross window lights the stair. Interior has chamfered axial beams.

House, early C17. Sandstone rubble with stone slate roof. 2 storeys. Lobby-entry plan. Windows mullioned, with hollow chamfer, outer chamfer, and hoods. To the left of the door are ones of 4 and 5 lights, to the right of one, 2, and 3 lights. The 1st floor windows are of 4, 2, 2, and 5 lights. The door has a chamfered surround with Tudor arch. Chimneys to left and right of door, and on left-hand gable set forward of the ridge. Coped gables with kneelers and ball finials. The left-hand gable wall has a 10-light mullioned and transomed window on the 1st floor. Inside, the door opens into a lobby against 2 large back-to-back fireplaces, originally with firehoods. Each has a stone jamb and a chamfered and stopped bressumer. The right-hand inglenook contains a smaller re-set stone fireplace with Tudor arch. The rooms served by the fireplaces have exposed chamfered and stopped main beams and common joists. The house contains much timber panelling, which appears to be C17 although incorporating some possibly early C16 work. Some of the panelling has been re-arranged and may have been imported from another building. The room to the right of the door is divided from the 2 right-hand rooms by a wall of vertical plank and muntin panelling with 2 intermediate horizontal rails and with 2 doorways with depressed arched heads each with an incised cross. Some of the muntins have carpenter's marks. The room to the left of the door has a similar panelled wall dividing it from the left-hand room, but the rails and muntins are moulded and the doorway has a Tudor-arched head with carved flower and tracery decoration in the spandrels. Set within the inglenook, surrounding a fireplace of C19 or C20 date is similar panelling with 2 doorways which have similar Tudor-arched heads, the upper parts of the doors also having tracery decoration. The stair is now within the lobby and has a straight flight with turned balusters. On the 1st floor there is further panelling.

House, c.1700, altered 1766. Watershot sandstone with slate roof. Double-depth plan. 2 storeys with attic, 2 bays. Windows sashed with glazing bars, with plain heads and moulded jambs. The single-storey gabled porch, between bays, has a moulded doorway with round arch. Between the 1st floor windows is a plaque inscribed: 'IW 1766'. Left-hand gable chimney with brick cap. At the rear are original ovolo-moulded mullioned windows: 2 of 3 lights on the 1st floor and a stair window with one mullion and 3 transoms. Interior has a closed-string dog-leg stair of 2 flights with turned balusters and one flight to the attic with splat balusters. On the 1st floor are 3 original doors.

Nos. 17 & 19 (Crabtree Cottages)

House, late C17, altered. Pebbledashed rubble with slate roof. 2 storeys, 4 bays, the 4th bay converted from a stable. Windows have rendered double-chamfered surrounds. Those to the 1st bay have had their mullions removed. The 2nd bay has one of 2 lights on the ground floor and one of 3 lights above. The 3rd bay has 2-light windows, the upper one possibly a modern copy. The 4th bay has modern windows in keeping, with central mullions. Doors at left and between 1st and 2nd bays, both with rendered surrounds. Inside, the right-hand room has a modern beam possibly replacing a firehood bressumer. The left-hand room has 2 chamfered axial beams mortised into a cross beam parallel with and close to the stone dividing wall. On the 1st floor there is a wall of large timber-framed panels.

Integrated barn and byre. Circa 1700. Coursed rubble, some elevations watershot; roof with stone slabs to roadside, Welsh slate to farmyard side, 3 units, store, barn and byre, the latter units divided by stone cross wall. Massive quoining throughout. Yardside elevation with entrances to each unit, that to the barn proper a wagon entry with heavily corbelled flanking walls under catslide. Small later window. Planked doors. Right return with 2 openings under massive lintels, and a later small window. Interior: original trusses with queen struts, 3 pairs of purlins and ridge piece; the byre truss with renewed king post. The barn has group value with Vicarage House (grade I, ref 2/78).
