II

House, mid C19th with C17th remains. Sandstone, squared and coursed at the front and rubble at the rear. Slate roof. Double-pile plan with gable stacks. 2 storeys with attics. North-west front of 3 bays, the windows being sashed with architraves. The door has a shouldered architrave with pulvinated frieze and triangular pediment. The gables have shaped bargeboards. The left-hand gable has a one-light attic window with the remains of a chamfered surround. The rear wall has double-chamfered mullioned windows. To the left of the porch is one of 5 lights with one of the lights blocked, to the right is one of 4 lights. On the 1st floor are 2 modern windows with plain stone surrounds. Between them is a tall stair window using the remains of double-chamfered surrounds. The door, inside an open stone porch, has a chamfered surround with triangular head.

Wheatley Farmhouse and former stable adjoining to the south (formerly listed as Wheatley Farmhouse)

Farmhouse, 'N^o 1774' on plaque. Squared, coursed sandstone with slate roof. House of central-entry double-pile plan with end stacks. 2 storeys with attic. Windows have plain stone surrounds, having lost their square mullions. The door has a shouldered architrave with narrow pulvinated frieze and moulded pediment. Attached towards the rear of the right-hand gable is a large stone brough carved from one piece of stone and dated '1832'. The rear wall has plain stone window surrounds, the 2 on the 1st floor retaining their square mullions and being of 2 lights. The rear door is now within a later extension and has an architrave with 'E^o 1758' incised on the lintel. Adjoining to the left is a former stable or shippon having a door with plain stone surround, and a round pitching hole with plain stone surround on the 1st floor of the left-hand gable. Above is a square pitching hole.

Lec House, Church of St. William of York and adjoining Presbytery

Roman Catholic. Church, mid 19th. Scored render with sandstone dressings and slate roof. The north and south walls have projecting quoins at their west end and are of 3 bays. The windows have chamfered plain stone surrounds, and hoods, with wooden cross windows with diamond-pattern glazing and 4-centred heads to the upper lights. The west wall has a moulded doorway with 4-centred head and hood. Above is a chamfered plain stone window surround with hood. The gable has a coping with a cross finial. The presbytery, which adjoins to the east, is of squared sandstone with a slate roof. It is of 2 storeys and 2 bays with end stacks. The windows are sashed with glazing bars in chamfered stone surrounds with hoods. The door, in the west wall, has a moulded stone surround with cornice hood.

Farmhouse, 'R A 1726' on door lintel. Slobbered rubble with slate roof. 2 storeys. Windows rebated and chamfered with mullions. On each side of the door is one of 3 lights, with 2 similar windows above on the 1st floor. At the left is a 2-light window on the ground floor and a 3-light chamfered window on the 1st floor. Further left is a door with plain reveals, with another door to its left now blocked to form a window. The chimney stack is to the left of the main door. There is a later outshut against part of the rear wall. In the rear wall of the main house is a chamfered window, formerly of 2 lights, and a similar 4-light window now with one central mullion remaining.

New House Farmhouse

Farmhouse, C17th, altered. Sandstone rubble with slate roof. 3-unit plan. 2 storeys. Continuous drip course over the ground floor, terminating beyond the windows and interrupted by a later gabled porch. To the left of the porch is a double-chamfered surround to a former 2-light window. To the right is a modern window with sawn stone surround. To its right is a blocked fire window, with a chamfered surround with its mullions removed further right. On the 1st floor there is a double-chamfered surround at the left, 2 blocked chamfered stair windows over the porch, a double-chamfered surround to their right and 2 chamfered surrounds further right. The right-hand gable has a 5-light double-chamfered mullioned window on each floor, with a door to the left with a plain stone surround of long and short stones. The left-hand gable has a 3-light chamfered mullioned window on the ground floor, with a similar window of one light on the 1st floor. At the rear there is an outshut against part of the wall. On each floor of the main house is a 3-light double-chamfered mullioned window, with a blocked one-light chamfered window on each fl. r to the right, close to the gable.

House, early C18th with C17th remains, much altered. Rendered rubble with slate roof. 2 storeys with attic. Facade has quoins with channeled rustication, continuous drip courses over ground and 1st floor windows, and a cyma moulded cornice gutter. The porch is gabled with a coping and 2 balls and a chamfered outer doorway with triangular head. On the lintel there is an inscription, difficult to read, but said by the VCH to be as follows: 'B.O. Michael Doughtie 1605'. Inside the porch is a cupboard door, once in the dining room, inscribed 'E.M. 1709'. The windows are sashed with no glazing bars in plain stone surrounds with 2 rebates and a chamfer. The ground-floor windows are larger, with 2 to the left of the porch and one to the right. The 1st floor windows probably originally had a mullion and a transom, with 4 to the left and one to the right of the porch. Chimneys on the gables. The left-hand gable wall has, towards the rear, a one-light rebated and chamfered window, now unglazed and opening into a compartment divided from the dining room, possibly associated with an alteration in the fireplace arrangements. Under the apex is a circular chamfered opening to the attic. The rear wall has 2 projecting external chimney stacks, now with later C19th caps. Against the wall is a later extension. Inside no C17th features are visible.

White Fold Farmhouse and Barn
adjoining to north-east

House, mid C18th. Sandstone rubble with roofs of stone slate and slate. Double-pile plan with central entry and end stacks. 2 storeys, 2 bays. Windows modern in rebated and chamfered surrounds, these either being late C17th and re-used or a late survival. The door has a plain surround of long-and-short stones. The right-hand gable has a tall stair window with plain stone surround and round head. The rear wing has C19th window details. Inside, the left-hand front room has a moulded shouldered fireplace. The barn adjoining to the left has a wide entrance with segmental head, 2 windows at a lower level to the left, one being a later insertion, and 3 shippon doorways in the gable wall, also at a lower level. Inside are softwood king-post trusses.
