1 PURPOSE

1.1 To inform members of progress to date with the capital programme for this committee for the current financial year.

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The original schemes put forward for the council's five-year capital programme exceeded the finance that was available. As a result a capital programme was approved for the 2009/10 financial year only.
- 2.2 For the future five-year capital programme 2010/15 it was agreed at budget working group that all previously proposed schemes for the period 2010/14 should now be set aside and that a full review should be undertaken of all schemes, including a review of those schemes previously approved through past five-year capital programmes.
- 2.3 Full Council approved the 2009/10 schemes on 10 March 2008.
- 3 2009/10 SCHEMES
- 3.1 There are no schemes for this committee that have slipped from 2008/09, therefore the scheme shown below is a new scheme approved as part of the 2009/10 capital programme.
- 3.2 The table below provides details of the one capital scheme for this Committee.

3.4 The budget for the Clitheroe town centre regeneration scheme was originally approved at a gross cost of £40,000 with a £20,000 contribution from Lancashire County Development Ltd (LCDL), resulting in a net budget of £20,000. However, when the scheme started this has changed to LCDL managing the scheme and the council simply paying its net contribution of £20,000 to LCDL.

- 4.1 The net budget on the town centre regeneration scheme has been fully expended, whilst work on the scheme is continuing.
