1 PURPOSE

- 1.1 To inform Members of the updated strategic assessment which has been produced by Ribble Valley Community Safety Partnership (RVCSP).

2 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Ribble Valley Community Safety Partnership (RVCSP) brings together the work of a number of statutory partner agencies:
 - Police.
 - Ribble Valley Borough Council.
 - Lancashire County Council.
 - NHS East Lancashire.
 - Lancashire Fire & Rescue Service.
 - Lancashire Probation Service.
- 2.2 Its main aim is to reduce crime in the Ribble Valley: in that it has been particularly successful over the past 10 years as we are currently the fifth safest local authority in England.
- 2.3 In order to tackle crime, the RVCSP undertakes a strategic assessment on what the problems are which it faces. This is done on a 3 year plan called a Strategic Assessment.
- 2.4 The current plan covers the period from 2008 to 2011 and is reviewed on an annual basis.
- 3 ISSUES
- 3.1 The strategic assessment looks at the whole range of crime and disorder problems being perpetrated in the Ribble Valley.
- 3.2 As you will see from the report, key areas for concern are:
 - serious acquisitive crime;

- substance misuse;
- anti-social behaviour;
- violent crime;
- criminal damage; and
- speeding in towns and villages.
- 3.3 Armed with this information, all agencies are now aware of what the problems are and more importantly where and when crimes are being committed.
- 3.4 The Community Safety Partnership currently has a number of initiatives which aim to reduce these problems including:
 - sports diversionary tactics for young people;
 - mentoring scheme with Ribblesdale School;
 - parents in partnership aimed at improving parenting skills;
 - various alcohol awareness initiatives including alcohol strips, polycarbonate glasses and anti-spiking caps;
 - operations secure to encourage property owners to secure both their homes and good within them; and
 - free fire safety checks.
- 3.5 All these initiatives are developed and supported by the Community Safety Partnership and accord with the findings of the Strategic Assessment.
- 4 RISK ASSESSMENT
- 4.1 The approval of this report may have the following implications:
 - Resources The funding for RVCSP comes from two main sources: Area Based Grant and Second Homes Money.

 - Reputation It is very important for the good reputation of Ribble Valley Borough Council that it continues to be one of the safest places in England.
