1 PURPOSE

- 1.1 The Gambling Act 2005 transferred responsibility for licensing premises used for gambling to this Council in 2007. The Council was required to formulate a Statement of Principles (gambling) which is to be reviewed every three years. The Council's Statement is based on the model format circulated by LACORS.
- 1.2 Relevance to the Council's ambitions and priorities

 The Council aims to provide efficient services. It also seeks to help make peoples lives safer and healthier. Proper control of gambling should allow gambling to take place with appropriate safeguards.

2 STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY

- 2.1 The Council's Licensing Committee considered the current Statement of Principles (gambling) at its meeting on 17 November 2009, and again on 16 March 2010 following a consultation exercise.
- 2.2 The Licensing Committee decided to make no changes to the Council's statement of principles (other than to update addresses, contact details etc).
- 2.3 Only one response was received in relation to the consultation exercise from BACTA (the British Amusement Catering Trades Association). The Licensing Committee resolved that the consultation response did not affect their proposals.
