Regulation 3 of the Order provides that:

"Before making a dog control order under section 55 of the Act, an authority shall-

- **e** consult upon its proposal to make the order by publishing a notice of that proposal in a local newspaper circulating in the area in which the land in respect of which the order would apply is situated
- 3 consult every other Authority having power under section 55 of the Act to make a dog control order in respect of all or part of the land in respect of which the proposed order would apply; and
- 0 where all or part of the land in respect of which the proposed order would apply is access land, consult-
- the access authority for that access land, and
- and in respect of any of that access land that is not situated in a National Park, the Countryside Agency. the local access form for that access land,




