

1 PURPOSE

- 1.1 To advise the sub-committee on the determination of an application required under section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 Relevance to the Council's ambitions and priorities
 - Community Objectives
 - Corporate Priorities

The Council aims to be a well managed Council; a robust licensing process contributes to that objective.

- Other Considerations
- 2 THE APPLICATION
- 2.1 The Seafood Pub Company Holdings Limited has made an application for a Premises Licence to be granted for the Assheton Arms, Downham, Clitheroe BB7 4BJ.
- 2.2 Although this is a new application, Members should be aware that a Premises Licence is already in force at the Assheton Arms and a copy of this is attached, for information, at **Appendix A**.
- A copy of the new licence application, consent of Designated Premises Supervisor and Licensing Plan are attached at **Appendix B**.
- 2.4 The activities applied for are as follows:
- [1] To supply alcohol for consumption on and off the premises:
 - Monday to Sunday: 0001hrs until Midnight
 - Alcohol will not be sold to persons other than residents and their bona fide guests other than between 1000hrs and 0100hrs. This condition will not apply between the hours of 0100hrs and 0200hrs on the last Friday before Christmas Day, on Christmas Eve, on the Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday Weekends and between 0100hrs on New Year's Eve and 1000hrs on New Year's Day.
- [2] To provide regulated entertainment in the form of live music, recorded music, performance of dance and anything of a similar description to that falling within (e), (f) or (g) all indoors only:
 - Monday to Sunday: 1000hrs until 0100hrs;
 - Christmas Eve: 1000hrs until 0200hrs;
 - Christmas Day: 1000hrs until 0200hrs:
 - Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday Weekends: 1000hrs until 0200hrs:
 - New Year's Eve: From the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

- [3] To provide late night refreshment indoors only:
 - Monday to Sunday: 2300hrs until 0500hrs.
- [4] To open the premises to the public:
 - Monday to Sunday: 0001hrs until Midnight.
- 2.5 The applicant in its operating schedule (Section M) describes the additional measures it intends to take to promote the four licensing objectives. These will become conditions of any licence granted.
- 2.6 Three relevant representations were originally submitted in respect of this application. Relevant representations can be made in opposition to, or in support of, an application and can be made by any individual, body or business that has grounds to do so.
- 2.7 Statutory guidance states: "A representation is "relevant" if it relates to the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of at least one of the licensing objectives" and "representations should relate to the impact of licensable activities carried on from premises on the objectives."
- 2.8 When representations are received, the Licensing Act 2003 and associated Guidance encourages mediation between all parties to try and resolve any concerns without the need for a formal hearing. Mediation has taken place, and the Applicant has now agreed to amend the application as follows:
 - The permitted timings for any regulated entertainment will terminate at 2300hrs instead
 of at 0100hrs as initially requested by the application;
 - The first condition on the application is also amended to the effect that alcohol may not be sold to any person other than residents or their bona fide guests after Midnight instead of after 0100hrs as initially requested by the application.
- As a result, two of the objectors have now withdrawn their representations. A copy of the remaining representation is attached at **Appendix C** and is made on the basis that the application will undermine the prevention of public nuisance objective.
- 2.10 A plan is attached at **Appendix D** showing the location of the premises.
- 2.11 All parties have been given notice of the hearing in accordance with Regulation 6 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.
- 3 THE LICENSING ACT 2003
- When determining an application, the Licensing Act 2003 requires you to have regard to the representations received from Responsible Authorities and/or Other Persons (including supporting information), statutory Guidance issued under s.182 of the Act, the authority's Licensing Policy Statement and take such of the steps as you consider necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives i.e.
 - The prevention of crime and disorder:
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 The steps you may take are set out at section 2 of the Licensing Hearings Guidance for Members, together with the statutory guidance issued under section 182 Licensing Act 2003 commencing at section 8.

- 4. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS ARISING FROM THE REPORT
- 4.1 Members are reminded that they must follow the rules of natural justice and they are bound by the code of conduct for elected members in licensing applications.
- 4.2 Members are reminded that they should have read or should hear all the facts prior to making a determination.
- 4.3 Members are reminded of the consideration they should give to the Human Rights Act 1998, in particular Article 1 the right to peaceful enjoyment of possessions, Article 6 the right to a fair hearing, Article 8 respect for private and family life and Article 10 the right to freedom of expression.
- 5. WARDS AFFECTED
- 5.1 The premises are situated within the Chatburn Ward. The ward councillor is not a member of this sub-committee.

ANNEX 1

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

- Section 19 of the Act provides that where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:
 - No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the (a) premises licence; or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- Section 19A of the Act provides that where a premises licences authorises the supply of alcohol 2. for consumption on the premises, the licence must include the following conditions:
 - The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant (1) premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children
 - games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or (a) encourage, individuals to -

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free, or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on -
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the

premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.

In this condition, permitted hours means:

- a. On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Year's Eve, 11.00am to 11.00pm.
- b. On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Year's Eve, 12 noon to 10.30pm.
- c. On Good Friday, 12 noon to 10.30pm.
- d. On Christmas Day, 12 noon to 3.00pm and 7.00pm to 10.30pm.
- e. On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday, 11.00am to 11.00pm.
- f. On New Year's Eve on a Sunday, 12 noon to 10.30pm.
- g. On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day, which would be 11.00am if New Year's Day falls on a weekday or 12 noon if a Sunday.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

ON-LICENCE

The above restrictions do not prohibit:

- during the first twenty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises.
- b. during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel.

- c. during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied consumption as ancillary to the meals.
- d. consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- e. the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or the despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
- f. the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club;
- g. the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale or supply of alcohol is carried out under the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
- h. the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
- the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.










Plan at Lower Ground Floor Level

Alcohol shall not be sold to persons other than residents and their bona fide guests other than between 10.00 and 01.00. This condition will not apply between the hours of 01.00 and 02.00 on the last Friday before Christmas day; on Christmas Eve; on the Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays of Bank Holiday Weekends and between 01.00 on New Year's Eve and 10.00 on New Year's Day.

All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in relation to the licensing objectives so as to reduce crime and disorder, promote public safety, prevent public nuisance and promote the protection of children from harm. Said training will be documented and will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be installed internally at the premises and will comply with the following criteria:-

- The system shall display on any recording the correct date and time of the recording;
- The system shall be recording at all times that the premises is open to the public;
- Recordings shall be held for a minimum of 28 days after said recording is made and will be made available for inspection to an authorised officer upon request;
- The CCTV will capture a head and shoulders image of any person who enters the premises through the main public entrance.

Whenever regulated entertainment is taking place, regular assessments shall be made of any noise emanating from the premises. Wherever said assessments indicate that noise is likely to cause nuisance to any local residents, remedial steps shall be taken to reduce the levels of noise.

Doors and windows will be kept closed whenever entertainment is taking place, except for the purposes of access and egress.

e) The protection of children from harm

A "Challenge 25" policy shall be in adopted and enforced at the premises whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be required to provide identification to prove that they are over the age of 18. The following forms of identification are acceptable as proof:

All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in relation to the Challenge 25 policy upon commencement of their employment, following which they will undertake refresher training at suitable intervals. Said training will be documented and will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

Persons under the age of twelve will not be permitted on the premises after 22.00 each day unless accompanied by a responsible person aged eighteen years or over.

Dear Sir/Madam,

We have received notice that The Assheton Arms, Downham, has applied for an extended licensing and entertainment license, and we would like to strongly object to these licenses being granted. The reasons for this are the extra noise pollution this would cause (we are already in discussion with the council and Downham Hall Estate Office in regards to the current noise pollution), we live directly behind the pub and their preparation building, which is separate from the main building, would mean the staff coming and going even longer hours than they do now. The bottle bank is also situated round the back, and they do not seem to care at what time of night they tip boxes of bottles into this, they have been asked not to do this after 9pm, but this has not happened. If the hours are extended there will be more bottles to be tipped at what hour? The extractor fan is situated on the back of the building and exhausts straight down our garden towards the house, if the hours were to be extended then this fan would be running 24 hours a day, meaning we would not be able to sit in our garden, our have our windows open because of the noise and cooking smells, (apparently this is to be altered within the next few months, but we have been battling for two years). The staff turn up for work at 7am to take deliveries, with reversing vehicles with different alarms on them, the longer hours would allow this to happen any time of night. Some of the staff park around the back of the pub, so again, extending these hours would mean more car doors slamming, and cars revving at all times of day and night, all of this affecting our sleep, as our cottage has only single glazed windows. Also round the front of the building there is a row of cottages to one side, these residents are also going to be subject to extra hours and for longer. Downham is a quiet, rural village that has no need for 24 hour a day drinking, we do not need or want the village peace and quiet disrupted by a chain of hoteliers that do not share any of the village ethos.
