1 PURPOSE

- 2 BACKGROUND
- 2.1 Committee will recall that at the Taxi meeting held on 13 September 2016, a request was made by licence holders for joint enforcement operations to be carried out by the Council, the Local Constabulary and the Vehicle and Operator Services Agency ("VOSA"). Inspector Goodall who was present at the meeting agreed to this proposal but made clear to licence holders that the operation would apply to all and any licence holders stopped in any operation. This was accepted by the licence holders present at the meeting.
- 2.2 The Council's Solicitor and Taxi Enforcement Officer subsequently met with the local constabulary and agreed a programme of enforcement operations. These enforcement operations took place during December 2016
- 3 ISSUES
- 3.1 The first operation took place on 5 December 2016, with the police, the VOSA and the Council's Taxi Enforcement Officer. The result of that operation was that 10 vehicles were stopped and checked. Five Private Hire Vehicles and five Hackney Carriage vehicles, one of which was licensed by Rossendale Borough Council.
- 3.2 Of the 10 vehicles stopped 8 were satisfactory. The other two were issued with a delayed prohibition and an immediate prohibition notice respectively.

Delayed Prohibition Notice

The vehicle was found to have a spare tyre below legal limit, a headlight not working, a near side brake light inoperative and wheel nut missing. The licence holder was required to have these issues resolved and a new MOT carried out within 4 days. The Council's Taxi Enforcement has confirmed that this was complied with.

Immediate Prohibition Notice

The vehicle was found to have both front tyres below legal limit. It was required to be immediately removed from use. The vehicle was not permitted to be used again until the tyres had been replaced and a new MOT certificate obtained. The Council's Taxi Enforcement Officer has confirmed that this was complied with.

- 3.3 The second operation took place on Friday 16 December 2016. The purpose of this operation was to identify drivers who were illegally plying for hire. In total 6 vehicles were targeted. Three of the drivers accepted the fare despite it not being pre booked. They were subsequently pulled over and warned. Infringement notices have also been sent to them under the Council's Infringement Notice scheme.
- 3.4 A press release was issued regarding both the operations and it is intended that further operations will be carried out with jointly with the police on a quarterly basis.
