1 PURPOSE

- 1.1 To advise the sub-committee on the determination of an application required under section 35 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 Relevance to the Council's ambitions and priorities
 - Community Objectives
 - Corporate Priorities

The Council aims to be a well-managed Council; a robust

licensing process contributes to that objective.

2 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant, Gisburne Park Estates Ltd, already has the benefit of a Premises Licence originally granted on 24 August 2017. The licence currently permits the supply of alcohol for consumption on and off the premises, regulated entertainment and late night refreshment.
- 2.2 A copy of the existing licence is attached at Appendix A (page 3).
- 2.3 The applicant has now made an application to vary the Premises Licence under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003. A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix B** (page 13).
- 2.4 Details of the licensable activities currently permitted, together with the variations applied for are set out in the table attached at **Appendix C** (page 36).
- 2.5 Twenty six relevant representations have been received. Relevant representations can be made in opposition to, or in support of, an application and can be made by any individual, body or business that has grounds to do so.
- 2.6 Statutory guidance states: "A representation is "relevant" if it relates to the likely effect of the grant of the licence on the promotion of at least one of the licensing objectives" and "representations should relate to the impact of licensable activities carried on from premises on the objectives."
- 2.7 A copy of the representations are attached at **Appendix D** (page 38) and relate to all four of the Licensing Objectives.
- 2.8 A plan is attached at **Appendix E** (page 95) showing the location of the premises.
- 2.9 All parties have been given notice of the hearing in accordance with Regulation 6 of The Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

3 THE LICENSING ACT 2003

- 3.1 When determining an application, the Licensing Act 2003 requires you to have regard to the representations received from Responsible Authorities and/or Other Persons (including supporting information), statutory Guidance issued under s.182 of the Act and take such of the steps as you consider necessary for the promotion of the four licensing objectives i.e.
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 3.2 The steps you may take are set out at section 3 of the Licensing Hearings Guidance for Members, together with the statutory guidance issued under section 182 Licensing Act 2003 commencing at section 8.

ANNEX 1

MANDATORY LICENSING CONDITIONS

- Section 19 of the Act provides that where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions:
 - (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
 - (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 2. Section 19A of the Act provides that where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, the licence must include the following conditions:
 - (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out,

arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

- (2) In this paragraph an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18

years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- 6. (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph (1) -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (D x V) where -
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of Value Added Tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the Value Added Tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the Designated Premises Supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "Value Added Tax" means Value Added Tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or Value Added Tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in relation to the licensing objectives so as to reduce crime and disorder, promote public safety, prevent public nuisance and promote the protection of children from harm. Said training will be documented and will be made available to an authorised officer on request.
- 2. A member of the management will carry out a risk assessment prior to each event to assess whether any door supervisors are required. Said risk assessment will be in writing and made available to an authorised offer on request.
- 3. Whenever regulated entertainment is taking place, regular assessments shall be made of any noise emanating from the premises. Wherever said assessment indicate that noise is likely to cause nuisance to any residents or businesses in the vicinity, steps will be taken to reduce the level of noise.

- 4. A "Challenge 25" Policy shall be adopted and enforced at the premises whereby any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be required to provide identification to prove that they are over the age of 18 before they are permitted to purchase alcohol. The only forms of acceptable identification will be:
 - A Passport
 - A UK Photocard Driving Licence
 - Official ID card issued by HM Forces or EU bearing a photograph and the date of birth of the holder
 - Any other form of identification agreed with a representative of the Police Licensing Unit
- 5. All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol will be trained in relation to the "Challenge 25" Policy upon the commencement of their employment, following which they will undertake refresher training at suitable intervals. Said training will be documented and will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

General Comments/Observations

- 1.1 I have reviewed the above noted application in terms of potential adverse impacts on the environmental health amenity of nearby residents.
- 1.2 The type of music and the level it is played at may be acceptable to those on the premises but often it is a common cause for complaints as those in the surrounding area can find it intrusive. These problems often occur because music levels within the premises tend to increase as the event progresses and when put against the background noise level, which generally tends to fall as the evening progresses, the noise level can seem at an increased level to those in the surrounding area.

Particular types of music such as dance music can cause a particular problem due to a strong bass beat, which tends to carry further. Music that emanates from outside the property from places such as a garden will often be much louder to neighbours than if it was inside the premises and would be more likely to cause a disturbance. Noise nuisance often becomes more of an issue if the premises is located in a rural or isolated area.

Conclusions/Suggested Conditions

2.1 I therefore recommend that, for all outdoors licensable activities, the variation is not permitted and that the licence retains the currently agreed times for all such outdoors licensable activities.

Our concerns relate to both Weddings and Festival Events since this license application will be applicable to both. The extra 2.5hours extension to the alcohol license from 00.30am to 03.00am will almost certainly result in the venue becoming an attraction for late night drinkers and revellers from surrounding pubs, bars and restaurants close at 'normal' closing times giving them another 3 hours of drinking.

Those conversant with the land immediately around the actual venue site will know that it can be accessed quite easily through dense woodland thereby avoiding the "controlled" official entrances.

We feel that the above combined with the isolated nature of the venue could increase the chance of Breaking and entering Drunk and disorderly Anti-social behaviour and a grave risk to vandalism Risk to Grade I & II Listed Buildings on the site

Public Safety

The immediate site is strewn with natural hazards and the danger of stumbling and falling is ever-present especially at night and to those who have had excessive alcohol consumption.

Stocks Beck runs through and divides the centre of the site and following a few hours of heavy rain it becomes an Bmtr wide x 4ft deep raging rocky river that within 100mtrs flows into the very much wider, and flercer, main fliver flibble. The event site is further divided by a public bridleway that runs at 90 degrees to Stocks Beck. After nightfall anyone using that bridleway within 2 to 3 steps would move away from the lighted areas and be in pitch darkness in very dense and steep woodland. In one corner of the site there is a 60ft high near vertical cliff face less than about 80 mtrs from the bridleway. This cliff is located on the very edge of the tree line and dangerously overhangs Stocks Beck. We believe for the reasons above that public safety will be compromised

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Since during times of Weddings and future Festivals much of the rental accommodation on the adjoining flibblesdale Park; where we have purchased our lodge; will be booked up for these events by the wedding guests or event attendees. The impact of these overnight guests on the park; should they have the right to continue to consume alcohol until 03.00am, would inevitably cause disturbances to Lodge owners as well as other guests staying at the Park, as these late night "party goers" come back to their accommodation between 3 and 4 in the morning, which would represent a wholly inappropriate intrusion into the quite enjoyment of our and other users of the



The Protection of Children from Harm

We feel that the exposure to disorderly behaviour, from adults that have been drinking for up to 16 hours under this new extension to the license is very real. We feel it can lead to excessively relax supervision of children where children are likely to be exposed to:-

- Potential danger of drowning, due to proximity to Stocks Beck and River Ribble.
- Risk of stumbling and failing from bridges and citifs, especially at night outside the lit area.
- Potential danger due to traffic entering and leaving site

We consider that this extension for another 2.5 hours of alcohol consumption is unnecessary and in any case we understand that a separate extension to the existing license can always be applied for up to a total of 12 occasions in any 12 month period. This extension would normally be granted without objection



The application to extend the current license to 03.00am would result in over 16 hours continues drinking time being made available. Entry and exit are either via Ribblesdale Park or through Gisburn Village and large groups from either a wedding or the new Festival events are inevitable. Groups fuelled by drink (regardless of age) can be loud and intrusive and can potentially lead to an altercation of drunken disorder and petty crime. Both of which could impact on those living or staying at properties bordering the licensing area.

Our lodge is less than 600 meters from the venue site and there are two entry / exit points from Ribblesdale Park to the Tepee Village and onto the Wedding / Festival area close by. We do hear music from the events (this does stop at the designated time period). However, those revellers who have accommodation in the rental lodges can be noisy, especially when they have been drinking, not realising how sound travels at night, which if this application is granted could be 03.00am and after. It certainly has the potential for crime and public disorder should they be challenged to keep the noise down.

Public Safety

We are assuming all the necessary Health and Safety Assessments and relevant documentation to hold these events has already been assessed and passed by the Council as being fit for purpose. However, the unknown in all of this is how groups will react and interact with each other once alcohol is added to the equation. Given the current pandemic this site is being promoted as the UK's first Socially Distancing Festival and an opportunity for 'socially distancing raving'. Perhaps not the best choice of words in an area that is surrounded by forest, has a river running through it and steep terrain and where alcohol could be available until 03.00am.

There will be an increase in both footfall, people walking from the event and traffic in and out of the site for private cars, taxis, coaches and minibuses all of which increases the risk for public safety.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

As stated above we are close to the designated licensing area and Ribblesdale Park rental lodges are already promoted as an accommodation option for the venue, which is understandable. However, those of us who have committed to being local and investing in the Ribble Valley for more than a weekend event e.g. the local residents of Gisburn and those of us who have invested in second homes on the Park, could be subject to public nuisance should the application for the license to consume alcohol until 03.00am be approved, which would represent a wholly inappropriate intrusion into the quite enjoyment of our stay.

Gisburne Park Estates have managed to run weddings for the past few years and by all accounts very successfully without the option to drink until 03.00am. A real concern is if this venue becomes an attraction for those who wish to continue their drinking after traditional pubs / restaurants have closed. Thus, seeing an influx of intoxicated individuals / groups with a potential for public nuisance and public disorder should they not be granted access - or vacating the site after 03.00am in a disorderly and noisy manner both by foot and cars moving in the area in the middle of the night.

The Protection of Children from Harm

It has been proven that excessive alcohol consumption can lead to many forms of harm both personally and to those vulnerable who fall within the care of parents / guardians. The mitigation of risk factors from the outset is the first line of protection. Given all the factors in relation to this application, including children who visit the site as part of a wedding party or with adults to one of the Festival events, again it is assumed the site has passed all tests set by the Council and relevant public bodies. However, the potential availability of alcohol until 03.00am could be a risk factor.



Extending the licensing hours to 3.00am will mean that people will be leaving the venue in the early hours when most people will be asleep and therefore not able to protect their property. One exit point will be through Ribblesdale Park. Indeed some of the event attendees will be stopping in one

of the lodges. Whilst there will be security at the venue there is no security on the Park and hence a risk of damage to the lodges fuelled by excessive alcohol consumption. In particular breaking and entering, vandalism, and anti-social behaviour. This is a particular concern for me as our lodge is often empty and has already been broken into and vandalised, despite being alarmed. **Public Safety** Extending the licencing hours is to encourage alcohol consumption and invariably excessive alcohol consumption. Whilst the immediate venue will be well lit the various access roads and paths are unlit. The paths are steep and uneven. The road is narrow, twisty and single track. With current events traffic is primarily one way with people arriving at the start and leaving at the end. Extending the hours will encourage people to arrive when other venues in the area have stopped serving alcohol. There will therefore be a period of two way traffic with people leaving after the main event has finished clashing with people arriving for the sole purpose of extending their evening by arriving at the only venue with a 3.00am licence. The Prevention of Public Nuisance The venue is a long way from the main road. The British public and Festival attendees are well known for leaving rubbish, urinating and worse in public places, making excessive noise and being physically abusive. My concern is with the people who will access and leave the venue through Ribblesdale Park, committing the above as a result of excessive alcohol consumption, which will be encouraged by the 3.00am extension. 

We own a holiday lodge on Ribblesdale Park and are concerned of the impact this extension to the current license will have on owners of lodges on the Park, Gisburn village and surrounding areas. We understand that businesses have to explore different means of encouraging customers, but we question what sort of events are planned which require a licence until 03.00am. Our lodge has open fields to the rear bordering the events site and is situated next to the entry / exit from Ribblesdale Park to the events venue, approx. 600 metres away. Our concerns are properties could be vulnerable, we are worried about anti-social behaviour and drink related disorderly conduct which may occur on the park and surrounding areas in the early hours of the morning. Revellers returning to rental lodges on the site possibly at 3.00am could cause problems with noise and disruptive behaviour.

Public Safety

As the venue is situated next to the river, steep sided woodland and cliff edges the 3,00am extension to the licence could result in 16 hours of continual drinking time, the potential for accidents is possible. There is difficult access to the site for emergency services.

The increase of traffic entering and leaving the site especially on the busy A59 in Gisburn Village, a difficult junction increasing the risk for public safety.

Has a robust risk assessment been carried out?

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

As our decision to invest in our second home 13 years ago was based on the tranquillity of the area, Ribblesdale Park and village, should this extension to consume alcohol until 3.00am be approved this could subject owners and visitors on the park and residents of Gisburn to noise, disruption and abusive behaviour. An influx of people to the venue after pubs have closed is a concern causing nuisance especially in the early hours of the morning when leaving the site by foot or vehicles, an intrusion on the peace of the area and not appropriate for a village setting.

Wedding celebrations have taken place in the last few years without the need to drink until 3.00am. There could be an impact on the environment of the area, light and noise pollution, littering and waste risking wild life.



Ribblesdale Park Lodge Owners Group - Objection to License Application made by Gisburne Park Estate

Overview:

Ribblesdale Park Lodge Owners Group are keen for visitors to come to the Park and enjoy the amenities of this very beautiful and historic area of the country. However, having discussed this at length and taking into account the existing license is available until 12.30am it is our opinion that an extension of a further 2.5 hours until 03.00am has the potential of adversely impacting on the quite enjoying of Lodge Owners time at the Park as well as those on holiday breaks on the Park. Two further concerns are the isolated nature of the venue would see greater disturbances due to traffic and revellers exiting the site from 03.00am onwards and the venue becoming an attraction for late night drinkers from surrounding towns and villages when pubs and restaurants close at 'normal' closing times.

For the reasons listed above it is our strong belief that this license extension will have a detrimental and negative effect on the whole local infrastructure both ecologically and socially.

It is our considered opinion that the extra extension for the wedding venue is unnecessary and should a small number of weddings request the serving of alcohol and other services until 3.00am then a separate extension to the existing license can always be applied for up to a total of 12 occasions in any 12 month period. This extension would normally be granted without objection.

We have no objections to the "Showing of Films" being added to the list of activities up until the current license time of 00.30am.

Background to Objection

Re: License Application by Gisburne Park Estates Ltd.

We wish to register our objection to the application by Gisburne Park Estates Ltd to extend their license from 00.30am until 03.00am.

Under the current arrangement the area known as a wedding venue enjoys flexibility to host events up to 28 days in any one year. The venue has no express planning permission and as such the extension of the licence would result in at least 16 hours of alcohol consumption, far greater than any other outdoor wedding venue in the area. In addition, Gisburne Park Estate have looked to diversify their business model and are taking the opportunity of the COVID-19 pandemic flexibilities provided by central Government to extend the range and use of the wedding venue into a 51 day Festival site.

Whilst in these uncharted times, all businesses are looking to explore innovative ways to encourage customers, a blanket extension to licensing hours has a detrimental impact for those wishing to visit the area for more peaceful pastimes, in particular in our case as Ribblesdale Park was promoted to us as a 'haven of beautiful quite countryside set within a 1000 acres of a private estate'. The tranquil surroundings of the Ribble Valley were key to the decision to invest in a second home locally.

We respectfully request that when considering this application, the wider impact on local as well as Park visitors is given priority. The wedding venue, which is a single house could not cater for large Bridal parties wishing to stay over. Therefore, guests will be offered use of Ribblesdale Park holiday let lodges and no doubt the new 'pop-up glamping' Tepee area that has also appeared. The impact of guests, should they have the right to continue to consume alcohol until 03.00am, would inevitably cause disturbances to other guests staying at the Park, which would represent a wholly inappropriate intrusion into the quite enjoyment of their stay.

For those wedding / Festival guests not staying overnight in local accommodation on the Estate they would have to leave its remote location by either private car, taxi, coach or minibus, which again would cause unreasonable disruption at that hour. Whilst this currently appears to be managed within the 28 day rule in any one calendar year (accepting that this is being extended by the government to 56 days due to COVID-19) we hope this is also being taken into consideration in the determination of the licensing application.

With the above points being the central focus of our objection i.e. a wedding venue which now appears to incorporate a 51 day Festival site being granted a 03.00am license extension presents a totally different scenario in terms of event planning and numbers attending, which would need to be addressed in order to not only hold a safe event but that those actions don't disadvantage local residents and Park Lodge owners, who have invested in being part of the Ribble Valley way of life, that a license to consume alcohol until 03.00am would seriously compromise.

We acknowledge that the hospitality industry, together with many other areas of the economy are looking at ways to promote local business and we understand Gisburne Park Estate has over 20 weddings booked for 2021. Granting a license extension beyond the current 12.30am limit has the real potential to negatively impact on all visitors to the Estate, the majority of which will not be wedding guests but lodge owners and the increase of holiday let business due to the upswing of 'staycations' with more people holidaying in this country as a result of the pandemic. Hindelini's, the bar / eatery on Ribblesdale Park also has a license until 11.30pm (02.30am on New Year's Eve) so the Estate is already well catered for in the serving of alcohol.

The extension to the alcohol licence is our main concern. There are range of other factors we have considered when looking at this application if alcohol is made available for an extended period of time, and for completeness we summarise them below:

Summary of Objection

The Prevention of Public Nuisance & Noise: APPENDIX "A"

- Noise, Disruption, Influx of people from surrounding towns and villages, in taxis, minibuses / coaches and private cars
- Individuals and Groups seeking Extra drinking time in and around the Venue area
- Potential for Physical and social disorder
- Disturbance from Loud noises, Light pollution, and objectionable odours
- Conduct that interferes with public health, safety, peace and or convenience

Public Safety: APPENDIX "B"

- The Venue is set within a wooded area intersected by tributaries of the River Ribble, Stocks Beck
 and a Public right of way. Access to these areas is easy and unobtrusive but conceals difficult
 terrain with the risk of stumbling and falling being ever-present especially at night. Adding
 excessive alcohol consumption until 03.00am does not mitigate the risk but could potentially
 increase it.
- Fast flowing River Ribble and Stocks Beck one or two hours of heavy rain and this Beck goes
 into spate becoming an 8mtr wide x 4ft deep raging rocky river that within 100mtrs flows into
 the very much wider, and fiercer, main River Ribble.
- Potential danger of drowning, due to proximity to Stocks Beck and River Ribble.

- Increased late night drinking, people travelling to Gisburn from Clitheroe and surrounding areas.
- Access Traffic and road networks, particularly entering Mill Lane and exiting the A59
- There is an unsupported culvert on the main single lane access road from the A59 to the hospital located at the lowest point of this road. Would it take the weight of a fire tender, probably impossible to know for sure?
- Vehicles entering and leaving site to and from the very busy A59 in the centre of Gisburn village are presented with a staggered junction and precariously blind corner.
- Difficult access to the event site by way of the narrow Bridleway as explained above.
- Health hazard, due to pollution of river course, (Stocks Beck and River Ribble).
- Broken glass from littering on unlit public area and rights of way.
- Light and noise pollution causing a public nuisance
- Potential obstructions and conflicts on public footpaths and bridleways
- Risk to Public Health if food waste, is not managed / disposed of properly will see a real increase in vermin to the area (as has already been reported nationally as a consequence of the lockdown).

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder: APPENDIX "C"

- Potential for Anti-social behaviour from uninvited attendees offered by undercover access routes to the venue site avoiding the official manned route(s).
- Breaking and entering NO
- Potential for Drunk and disorderly behaviour—both in the Park, surrounding areas and on the streets of Gisburn
- The Festivals are likely to attract a clientel that are potentially drawn to drug use and/or abuse
- Risk to Grade I & II Listed Buildings (Gisburne Park Hospital) directly behind Venue and surrounding areas of Glamping site owing to difficulty in policing difficulty in policing such large structures that directly abut dense woodland and undergrowth.

The Protection of Children for Harm: APPENDIX "D"

- Potential danger of drowning, due to proximity to Stocks Beck and River Ribble.
- Risk of stumbling and falling from bridges and cliffs, especially at night outside the lit area
- Potential danger due to traffic entering and leaving site
- Potential for exposure to adult drinking and disorderly behaviour, particularly when attending family gatherings late into the night.

Environmental & Pollution

- Impact on infrastructure of the village, Ecologically and Socially
- Risk and disturbance to wildlife and their habitats, both native and migratory; particularly to nocturnally active wildlife.
- River course pollution, littering and general waste
- Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB is land protected by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 (CROW Act). It protects the land to conserve and enhance its natural beauty.


