# Core Strategy 2008 – 2028: A Local Plan for the Ribble Valley Supporting Paper in relation to the Duty to Cooperate

Thank you for consulting us on the above which was received by Natural England on 19 June 2013.

Natural England is a non-departmental public body. Our statutory purpose is to ensure that the natural environment is conserved, enhanced, and managed for the benefit of present and future generations, thereby contributing to sustainable development.

We can confirm that the Local Planning Authority has consulted Natural England on the preparation of the Core Strategy. However, we would expect to see further detail on how Natural England's comments and advice have been considered during the plan making process. In particularly we would wish to highlight the following:

#### Landscape

It is not clear from the information provided whether outstanding concerns relating to landscape impacts on the Forest of Bowland Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) have been addressed, in particular our comments made under reference 69782-67282(27/11/12) regarding our request for landscape evidence, which we also raised during an earlier response dated 14/06/2012, reference 53144. Our advice states that there does not appear to be any site specific assessment of the landscape with respect to the strategic housing site and the potential impacts on the AONB and we requested clarification on the comment that 'detailed work on this would still be needed.'

## **Habitats Regulations Assessment**

We have responded recently (19/6/13) by email reference 86459 and stated that subject to the comments made inour response. Natural England was able to agree with the conclusions of the revised screening report. It is not clear how our comments have been taken forward and it would be useful to discuss this further in the Duty to Co-operate statement.

#### **Cross Boundary issues**

The statement does make reference to cross boundary relationships and we welcome the reference to the Joint Advisory Committee for the Forest of Bowland AONB

Natural England Foundry House 3 Millsands Riverside Exchange Sheffield S3 8NH However it is not clear whether any other issues have been considered with respect to the natural environment. The statement outlines that 'the Council participates in a wide range of conservation issues' however it is not clear what this involves. It would be beneficial to cross reference any comments made on transboundary issues identified in the Sustainability Appraisal and how these issues have been considered during the plan making process.

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



Having read the documents you listed on the letter, it would appear that you have given sufficient coverage of the circumstances regarding Ribble Valley's development plans and their duty to co-operate with other relevant bodies.

However, from a Children and Young People's Directorate perspective, there does not appear to be any mention of Section 106 requirements with regard to provision of places for pupils or any other building requirements for educational purposes.

It may be that Ribble Valley BC have no direct responsibility for school provision, but from our perspective it may have been an opportunity to have made reference to Lancashire County Council's role in school provision and their requirement to obtain Section 106 funding.

There is a strongly held view in the Provision Planning function that District authorities have a vital role to play in the negotiations between developers and the Districts in terms of attaining appropriate funding under Section 106.

#### **CONSULTATION ON PLANNING MATTERS**

While the CAA has a duty to provide aviation safety advice when requested, it is not a statutory consultee for planning applications (unless its own property is affected). In order to reduce the time devoted to unnecessary consultations, the following guidance aims to clarify requirements.

Other than the consultation required by Section 110 of the Localism Act 2011, it is not necessary to consult the CAA about:

- Strategic Planning Documents (e.g. Local Development Framework and Core Strategy documents) other than those with direct aviation involvement (e.g. Regional Renewable Energy Plans);
- Waste Plans;
- Screening Options;
- Low-rise structures, including telecommunication masts. With the exception of wind turbine developments, the CAA is unlikely to have any meaningful input related to applications associated with structures of a height of 100 feet or less that are situated away from aerodromes or other landing sites;
- Orders affecting Rights of Way or Footpaths;
- Sub-surface developments;
- General planning applications not affecting CAA property.
