PROPOSED MAIN CHANGES TO SUBMITTED CORE STRATEGY & STRATEGIC HOUSING LAND AVAILABILITY ASSESSMENT (SHLAA) UPDATE

Thank you for the various consultations seeking the views of United Utilities as part of the development plan process.

United Utilities wishes to build a strong partnership with all Local Planning Authorities (LPAs) to aid sustainable development and growth within the North West. We aim to proactively identify future development needs and share our information. This helps:

- ensure a strong connection between development and infrastructure planning;
- deliver sound planning strategies; and
- inform our future infrastructure plans which are submitted to our regulator.

Water and wastewater services are vital to the growth and development of communities and environment. When progressing the development plan and future policies, LPAs should consider the impact of new development and ensure adequate infrastructure capacity is available. If infrastructure deficiencies exist, it is preferable to seek an alternative location. If this is not possible, consideration should be given to the timescale for improvements to infrastructure and delivery of the development to ensure these are co-ordinated. United Utilities welcomes Policy DMG1 which states it may be necessary to phase development to allow infrastructure enhancements to take place in the event that infrastructure with capacity is not available.

However United Utilities does particularly support the proposed modification of Policy EN3: Sustainable Development and Climate Change whereby the Council will 'assess applications against the current Code for Sustainable Homes, Lifetime Homes and Buildings for Life and BREEAM Standards'. United Utilities has no further comments at this stage regarding the emerging Core Strategy.

With regards to the Strategic Housing Land Availability Assessment, United Utilities is currently undertaking a review of the sites identified and will provide a response to the Council as soon as possible.

United Utilities will seek to work in co-operation with the Council through the plan process as a means to ensure the Borough's future growth can be supported by the necessary sustainable infrastructure.
