I am writing to raise my concerns regarding further delays to the adoption of the Core Strategy which is based on your statement that "some people may not have been clear about what the proposed modifications were"

This seems to be yet another attempt to delay this document, which will therefore assist the developers in getting their numerous and excessive planning applications approved.

As the Inspector seems very concerned that these consultation processes are followed to the letter could I ask that he be made aware of what occurred with Site 385 in Longridge.

I understand that, on the advice of your planners, this was specifically excluded from the documents considered by the Committee which was being asked to confirm the draft Strategy for public consultation. This was on the basis that it would increase the size of the settlement by 25%.

However, site 385 is now included in the Schedule and appears, for whatever reason, to be an attempt by the Council to do so by the back door.

One of the factors the Planning Inspector should take into account when considering the final draft Strategy is the extent to which legal and procedural requirements have been met (your letter of 9th August 2013 refers). I would therefore suggest, on this basis, site 385 should be removed from the final version of the Core Strategy as not only has it not followed the "due process" but the size of this site is such that it can be regarded as a further Strategic Housing site of which the original document stated there should only be one.

I would welcome you sharing this letter with the relevant Inspector.
