THE LAW; legal limits are set for

'schools that are within 150 metres of nitrogen dioxide NO2 pollution levels that exceed the EU legal limit of 40µg/m3 (40 micrograms per cubic metre of air).'

AND 'schools in areas of illegally toxic levels of NO2.'

There are many empty warehouses and plots of land beyond Grimsargh near the M6 J31a or on the A59 which would be more suitable for a development of this type. HGV's are swamping the roads .Please look at the 'Core Strategy for recommended alternative sites located on A59 corridor' and advise Ribble Valley Borough Council to "minimise detriment to the historical heritage, character and beauty of the area" and take account of the ill effects on patient health.
