AS THE LICENSEE, I ENSURE THAT MYSELF AND MY STAFF PROMOTE ALL FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES AT ALL TIMES. THERE IS ALWAYS SUFFICIENT AND COMPETENT, TRAINED STAFF ON DUTY AT THE BISTRO TO ATTAIN THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE LICENCE, FOR PREVENTING CRIME & DISORDER, TO UPHOLD PUBLIC SAFTEY, THE PROVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE AND THE PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
THERE IS ALREADY CCTV AT THE BISTRO, WE HAVE 4 CCTV CAMERAS INSIDE AND 3 OUTSIDE AND WE WILL BE INSTALLING 4 MORE CAMERAS IN THE EXTENTION AND OUTSIDE THE ENTRANCE/EXIT, COVER THE FLOOR WITH A WIDE ANGLED VIEW, ALSO FOR FULL IDENTIFICATION PURPOSES. THERE IS ALSO, TIMED OUTDOOR LIGHTING AND WARNING SIGNAGE, EXPLAINING THAT 'YOU ARE BEING FILMED'.  WE HAVE INTERNAL POLICYS AND TRAINING, OF AWARENESS OF HANDING AGGRESSIVE SITUATIONS TO MINIMIZE CRIME AND DISORDER AND HOW THE STAFF ARE TO HANDLE ANY SORT OF RISING SITUATION.  WE ALSO HAVE A GOOD REPORE WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND BUSINESSES IN THE AREA, WE ARE IN REGUAR

CONTATC IF ANY CRIMES HAVE BEEN COMMITED AND WILL PROVED ANY HELP WE CAN TO THE POLICE AND OTHER DEPARTMENTS. ALONGSIDE SIGNING UP TO "IN THE KNOW" POLICE MAILING LIST, WE ARE INFORMED OF ANY ACTIVITES

IN THE LOCAL AREA.

WE HAVE THE RIGHT TO REFUSE TO SELL ANY ALCOHOL AND A LOG BOOK TO FILL OUT THE RELEVANT INFORMATION AND REASONS WHY, EITHER DUE TO UNDER AGE OR CONSUMPTION AMOUNT, WHICH WILL PREVENT ANY SORT OF DISORDER. WE HAVE A DRUG AND WEPON RISK ASSESSMENT COMPLETED, AND WE URGE STAFF TO COMPLY WITH THE GUIDANCE. WE NEVER HAVE A LONE WORKER, AS THIS CAN BE A ALWAYS TWO MANAGERS OPENING AND CLOSING THE BISTRO AND A DESIGNATED SMOKING AREA AT THE BOTTOM OF THE CAR PARK AND PROVIDING A CIGARETTE BIN, TO PREVENT ANY SORT OF CONGREGATION AROUND THE COURTYARD. MOREOVER, WE DO NOT ALLOW THE PUBLIC TO CONGREGATE OUTSIDE THE BISTRO AFTER THEIR MEAL, WE SWIFTLY MOVE THEM ALONG TO MINIMIZE THE RISK OF ANY DISORDER. WARNING NOTICES WITH REGUARDS TO UNRULLY BEHAVIOUR, THAT WE HAVE A ZERO TOLLARANCE TO PSYCOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL HARM, OF TEATMENT OF STAFF AND OTHER CUSTOMERS.

## c) Public safety

ENSURING THAT THE PREMSIS IS SAFE FOR THE STAFF AND PUBLIC AT ALL TIMES, BOTH INSIDE AND SURROUNDING AREAS, ENSURING THAT ALL RISK ASSESSEMENTS ARE AVAILABLE AND PUBLIC SAFETY IS OF THE UPMOST.

AVOIDING ANY CONGRIGATION OF THE PUBLIC IN ONE AREA (INSIDE OR OUTSIDE)

RISK ASSESMENTS FOR HEALTH & SAFTEY, FIRE POLICY, ENVIORMENTAL POLICY AND THE ACTION OF '

CONSIDERED, ASSESSED AND ADDRESSES' METHOD IS USED AT ALL TIMES AND THAT ALL EMERGENCY EXITS SHALL BE KEPT FREE FROM OBSTRUCTION AT ALL TIMES.

OUTDOOR AND INDOOR LABELING OF STAIRWAYS, AND OUTDOOR STEPS ARE PAINTED WITH A VISIBLE WHITE LINE TO BRING ATTENTION TO THE PUBLIC, TO MINIMIZE SLIPS, TRIPS AND FALLS.

MAKING SURE THERE ARE ENOUGH STAFF ON THE PREMISIS IN RELATION TO CUSTOMERS AT ONE TIME AND KEEPING SETTING CAPACITY LIMITATIONS.

WE FOCUS ON STAFF TRAINING AND ALWAYS MAINTAIN PUBLIC STAFTY IS PARAMOUNT, WITH OUR DAILY TRACK/ GUIDANCE CHECK SHEETS, MAKING SURE NO RISKS TO THE PUBLIC OR STAFF.

PROVIDING BINS AROUND THE GROUNDS, TO MAKE SURE NO LITTER IS DROPPED, AND IF SO, PICKED UP. CLEANING UP THE COURTYARD OF ANY LEAVES, OR ANYTHING THAT COULD CAUSE ANY ACCIDENTS.

NEVER ALLOWING CONGRIGATIONS OF THE PUBLIC IN ONE AREA, SWIFTLY MOVING PEOPLE ALONG.

APPROPRIATE FIRE SAFETY PROCEDURES ARE IN PLACE, INLCUDING FIE EXTINGUISHERS (H20, FOAM AND CO2), A FIRE BLANKET, EMERGANCY LIGHTING, INERNAL ILLUMINATED FIRE EXIT SIGNS AND MANY SMOKE DETECTORS (PLEASE SEE ATTACHED PLANS FOR MORE DETAILS OF LOCATIONS)

REPORTING ANY FIRE ISSUES TO THE FIRE SERVICE IMMEDIATLY

HAVING A FULL FIRST AID KIT AT ALL TIMES AND ADDING MORE FIRST AIDERS AND FIRE MARSHALS TO BE TRAINED, DUE TO THE INCREASE IN CUSTOMERS ON THE PREMISIS WITH THE NEW EXTENTION. WE ALSO REPORT ANY ACCIDENTS IN THE RELEVANT ACCIDENT REPORT BOOK, SIGNED AND DATED, ALONGSIDE TO CONTACT RIDDOR IF NEEDED. WARNING NOTICES WITH REGUARDS TO UNRULLY BEHAVIOUR, THAT WE HAVE A ZERO TOLLARANCE TO PSYCOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL HARM, OF TEATMENT OF STAFF AND OTHER CUSTOMERS.

# d) The prevention of public nuisance

WE ENDEVOUR TO ASK ALL CUSTOMERS AND STAFF TO LEAVE THE PREMISIS QUIETLY, ALONGSIDE HAVING NOTICES UP IN THE DOORWAY, REMINDING CUSTOMERS TO LEAVE QUITELY AND RESPECT AND REGUARD TO OUR NEIGHBOURS, PEOPLE WHO DO NOT COOPERATE WILL BE BANNED FROM THE PREMISES. WE ALSO PROMOTE GOOD COMMUNICATION WITH THE NEIGHBOURS. NO BOTTEL BINS ARE TO BE DISPOSED OF PASSED THE TIME OF 9PM, THEY WILL BE REMOVED THE FOLLOWING DAY, TO ENSURE NO NOISE IS BEING MADE FOR THE NEIGHBOURS.

TO KEEP THE COURTYARD TIDY WE PLACE A RUBBISH BIN AROUND THE AREA TO REDUCE LITTER, IF ANY DROPPED, IT IS PICKED UP AND DISPOSED OFF.

WE ALSO KEEP THE LEVEL OF RECORDED MUSIC TO A LOW LEVEL, NOT TO BE HEARD OUTSIDE AND ADHEAR TO THE LICENCED TIMES ALOCATED.

TIMED MIINIMAL EXTERNAL LIGHTS ARE SET TO AUTOMATICALLY SWITCH ON AND OFF, AND DO NOT CAUSE ANY LIGHT POLUTION.

MAKING SURE THAT THE PUBLIC DO NOT CONGRIGATE IN THE AREA, TO PROVENT ANY PUBLIC NUISANCE OR NOISE TO THE RESIDENTS OF THE COURTYARD.

HAVING A DESIGNATED SMOKING AREA, AT THE BOTTOM OF THE CAR PARK, WITH A CIGARETTE BIN.

MAKING SURE THE LEVEL OF THE RECORDED MUSIC IS TO A REASONABLE LEVEL

WARNING NOTICES WITH REGUARDS TO UNRULLY BEHAVIOUR, THAT WE HAVE A ZERO TOLLARANCE TO PSYCOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL HARM, OF TEATMENT OF STAFF AND OTHER CUSTOMERS.

### e) The protection of children from harm

TO PROTECT CHILDREN FROM HARM, THE LICENSEE AND STAFF WILL/DO ASK PERSONS WHO APPEAR TO BE UNDER THE AGE OF 25, FOR ID (PHOTOGRAPHIC) SUCH AS DRIVING LICENSE, PASSPORT FOR VERIFICATION OF THEIR AGE. ALL STAFF ARE TRAINED IN UNDERAGE SALES PROVENTION, THEY ARE ALSO DIRECTED TO THE CHECK 25 REFUSAL OF ALCOHOL REGISTER LOGBOOK, IF THIS OCCURS WE ENTER ALL THE RELEVANT DETAILS AND THIS IS MAINTAINED ON THE PREMISES. WE ALSO ADHEAR TO THE ACT THAT PROHIBITS CHILDREN AGES LESS THAN 16 YEARS OLD, UNACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT.

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
  audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
  licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
