Describe Briefly The Nature Of The Proposed Variation

Describe the premises. For example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place for consumption of these off-supplies, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

The current licenced premises are Grindleton Pavilion which is a community hall and the flagged area immediately adjacent to the main door on the east side of the building.

We wish to increase the licenced area to include the Football field which lies to the east of the Pavilion and land lying to the north of that and also the car park area lying to the south of the Pavilion. All of these areas are further away from the main residential area of the village. See attached plans for reference.

From time to time we have applied for temporary event notices to cover these areas to enable us to serve alcohol when we have had events such as a village fair, bonfire night and other social gatherings. These events would usually be no more than two to four each year. Clearly, we would not be using the entire licenced area at any one time, but it would give us the flexibility to place stalls selling alcohol wherever seemed most appropriate depending on the nature of the event.

It would give us more flexibility and enable us to react more spontaneously to external events such as the weather if we had a permanent licence to cover these areas rather than having to apply for a temporary event notice.

Having had a temporary event notice to cover these various events in the past we know from experience that this has not caused any problems with the local residents in terms of noise or disruption. We are not proposing having any more events than we currently do, just making it easier to organise them.

The Pavilion has been licenced for the sale of alcohol since 2012 and in that time has had no issues with regard to crime and disorder. Events where alcohol is on sale are closely monitored by the bar staff with regard to noise levels, closure of doors and windows as per our planning permission and refusal to serve alcohol to anyone under age or who is drunk.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Refusal to serve anyone who is drunk or otherwise deemed to be potentially disruptive.

c) Public safety

The bar staff closely monitor the situation and intervene if there is any behaviour causing concern.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Users of the hall are reminded to leave the premises quietly. If music is being played this is monitored and advised to reduce the volume if too loud.

If a large event with music is planned or a late event we notify neighbours

e) The protection of children from harm

All trustees are fully conversant with safeguarding issues for children and vulnerable adults. Children are always under the supervision of their parents or a suitable adult nominated by parents.

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

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PAYMENT DETAILS
